Students who achieve less than a 75% average on exams (excluding open book online exams) will receive a final course grade of D unless their exam average is calculated to be an F.

### Grading and Rounding Policy:

The MSU School of Nursing provides students with the educational opportunities needed to develop the knowledge, skills, and competencies necessary for professional nursing. All nursing courses must be passed with a grade of "C" (70%) or higher. Calculating a course grade will follow the process outlined below:

- The cumulative average of all exams in the didactic (lecture) component of this course **MUST be equal to, or greater than, 75%.** Exams will be defined in the course syllabus.
- Students who achieve 60% to 75% on exams will receive a final course grade of a "D". If their cumulative exam percentage is calculated to be less than 60%, an "F" will be given as the final course grade.
- After a 75% or higher is earned as the exam average in the didactic component of this
  course, the remainder of the course components will be calculated into the course grade.
  The final course grade will be the average of all components of the course.

For calculation of a final course grade, the final course grade must be 0.5 or higher in order to be rounded up to the next higher whole number.

### Exams:

Regular exams will be taken in the classroom. All exams will be given according to the course schedule located at the end of this syllabus and are to be taken as scheduled. Time and dates are non-negotiable. If extenuating circumstances occur, the student is responsible for contacting the faculty member <u>prior</u> to the testing period. Failure to notify the faculty before the scheduled day of the exam will result in a 10% penalty of the total points of the test per day.

No ball caps will be allowed while taking a quiz or exam. Water bottles will be kept on the floor. Students are not allowed to have personal computers, books, pen/pencil, paper, purse, book bag, cell phone, pagers, or similar communication devices within the area where they are taking the exam. See BSN handbook for more information on testing policies. Students will have 5 days after an exam or quiz to contest any discrepancies. All material in the text from assigned chapters is testable information.

### **Faculty Availability:**

Office hours will be as listed above or other times by appointment. Email is the preferred method of contacting the instructor. Every attempt will be made to answer emails received Monday through Friday within 24 hours. Emails received after 1700 Friday will be answered by 1700 the following Monday. #### NUR 325: The Pediatric Client Clinical Experience

<u>Credit hours:</u> 2 (0-6) <u>Prerequisites</u>: NUR 323 and progression in the BSN nursing program.

<u>Course Description</u>: Professional nursing care of pediatric clients and their families in diverse settings, includes clinical experience of not less than 96 hours. Students are required to pass all clinical requirements in order to pass this course.

<u>Course Teaching Methods</u>: Clinical experience is an interactive environment between the student nurse, preceptor, pediatric client and family. The student will apply course content from NUR 323 and previous nursing coursework in observation and direct client care experiences in a community health care setting.

NUR 323 & NUR 325 create a Service-Learning Integrated Course Integrated service learning (ISL) that incorporates a community service experience with classroom instruction has been integrated into this course to provide a community based learning experience. Service learning addresses the practice of citizenship and promotes an awareness of and participation in public affairs. The Integrated servicelearning course requires a minimum of 15 hours of unpaid service to a not-for-profit community organization, government agency or public service provider. The CASL office and course instructor approves Camp Barnabas. The community service placement will relate to the course learning objectives as outlined in this syllabus. Reflection assignments are assigned to help students understand discipline concepts and develop higher order critical thinking skills. #### General guidelines for the clinical experience:

Students will have a pediatric clinical experience during a week at Camp Barnabas over the summer according to the schedule posted on Blackboard.

- 1. The student is expected to apply skills and knowledge from previous courses to the clinical situation.
- 2. The student is expected to show progress throughout the clinical experience.
- 3. The student will provide documentation of how each clinical objective has been met. For this course, documentation in a clinical log (Typhon) and a clinical evaluation tool (CET) narrative will be used. These documents are required as part of the student's portfolio.
- 4. The student and the clinical supervisor will complete a final evaluation at the end of the clinical using the clinical evaluation tool (CET) narrative. <u>It is the student's responsibility to upload the final clinical evaluation tool (CET) narrative to their portfolio prior to the end of the semester.</u>
- 5. The student is expected to use a systematic approach to patient care. Effective communication, therapeutic nursing intervention, and critical thinking are essential skills for nurses to provide quality care to pediatric patients. The student will be an active participant in identifying his/her own learning needs and developing a plan to improve clinical performance and correct deficits.
- 6. The student is expected to continually increase critical thinking skills by showing an interest in seeking new information to solve patient problems. The student is expected to show a progression in the level of clinical performance in the roles of provider, manager, coordinator, and designer of care, as documented on the clinical evaluation tool narrative.
- 7. Clinical supervisors will provide guidance, coaching, and support to students as needed. Clinical supervisors will continually evaluate the student's application of knowledge and skills in the clinical setting.

The student will meet the following expectations at every clinical experience. A student failing to meet the expectations may be removed from the clinical situation at the discretion of the clinical faculty, and may result in disciplinary action including failing the clinical component of the course. Continued progress in the program will then be reviewed by the Admission, Progression, and Graduation Committee in the School of Nursing.

- 1. Be on time to the clinical facility and do not leave before scheduled leaving time without approval from the clinical supervisor and notification to the RN preceptor.
- 2. Always be appropriately dressed. Students will follow the dress policy as stated in the Student Nurse Instructions for Camp Barnabas posted on Blackboard.
- 3. Always have a professional and courteous approach that reflects respect of self, patients, colleagues, visitors, and the profession of nursing.
- 4. Demonstrate safety in clinical performance. Recognize own limitations and seek help accordingly.

- 5. Assist in controlling the environment to protect the patient, members of the health care team, and others from real and/or potential hazards.
- 6. Always keep the clinical supervisor and the RN in charge of the assigned patient/s informed of changes in the patient's condition.
- 7. Always have medications checked by the clinical supervisor or the RN designated by the clinical supervisor prior to administration.
- 8. Always have documentation reviewed prior to entry on the patient's chart and following entry on the patient's chart.

<u>Clinical Assignments:</u> The student will submit clinical assignments online through Typhon, and through email (CET). Detailed instruction sheet provided in Blackboard for Typhon and CET criteria.

- <u>Typhon:</u> The student will enter a complete Typhon entry for each full day of clinical at Camp Barnabas (5 total entries). You will need to take notes each clinical day so you can enter it into Typhon later. Choose one patient to focus on each day, but put all the competencies you performed and medications you gave for all your patients each day. The student will receive points for their initial Typhon submission <u>only</u>. All Typhon corrections must be complete and resubmitted within 5 business days. After two (2) "Not Approved" submissions the student will receive a zero "0" for the submission. The Typhon entries must be complete and "Approved" with at least 80% of total points to receive a grade of "Pass" for the clinical component of NUR323: The Pediatric Client.
- Clinical Evaluation Tool (CET): The student will download the template for the NUR323 CET from Blackboard and bring it to Camp Barnabas. The CET contains a numbered list of clinical objectives to be met during the clinical experience. The student will record the date of the clinical experience on the CET and describe how the objective was met by the student. The student is required to meet each clinical objective a minimum of one (1) time.

  Email your completed CET narrative to your clinical supervisor within 5 business days from the conclusion of the clinical experience. Any necessary CET narrative corrections must be completed by the student and resubmitted within 5 business days of the clinical instructor's email notification. The student is NOT permitted to delete any instructor comments. The student will only be allowed one (1) resubmission.

All objectives on the CET must be met and documented satisfactorily by the student, and approved by the assigned clinical supervisor.

#### **Clinical Absences:**

Clinical experiences are required to meet the objectives of the nursing courses. Clinical experiences are arranged for the student to practice the art and science of pediatric nursing in a real-world setting. Camp Barnabas has agreed to allow students the opportunity to apply their skills and knowledge in an alternative setting and expect students to conduct themselves in a professional manner.

- 1. It is the student's responsibility to arrive on time and be present for the entire clinical experience.
- 2. If the event of an emergency and the student is anticipating arriving late, leaving early, or being absent from activities, the student must notify the clinical supervisor immediately. Tardiness or absence from all or part of the clinical experience will result in disciplinary action.
- 3. A pattern of repeated tardiness or absence from the clinical activities is unprofessional behavior and may result in disciplinary action including failing the clinical component of the course and dismissal from the nursing program.

4. Falsification of attendance at a clinical activity by a student will result in disciplinary action, including possible dismissal from the nursing program.

<u>Final Clinical Evaluations:</u> The student will schedule a final clinical evaluation appointment with the clinical supervisor at the end of the clinical rotation at Camp Barnabas. The clinical evaluation with faculty must be complete to receive a clinical grade.

#### **PRE-REQUISITES:**

Introductory biology course and physiology course.

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Exploration of pathophysiology with a focus on health care problems relevant to the entry-level nurse or healthcare professional.

#### **COURSE PURPOSE:**

This course provides an introduction to the essential concepts of major diseases/disorders and disease processes. Topics include inflammation, infection, neoplasm, degeneration, aging, congenital and genetic disorders, immune deficiency, and autoimmune disorders.

#### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

- 1. Define the basic terminology related to pathophysiology
- 2. Define and review normal human anatomy and physiology
- 3. Define, review, and explore the structure and function of each major body system
- 4. Define the basic pathogenesis of human disease.
- 5. Explore the most common disorders and diseases related to each of the major body systems
- 6. Explore the most common etiologies and predisposing factors associated with human disease
- 7. Define the basic approach to treatment of various disorders based on current science and clinical practice.

#### **COURSE OVERVIEW**

- Each student must enroll in **Blackboard** and have ready access to a computer, as well as skills, hardware and software necessary to receive and send required assignments on the MSU Blackboard system.
- Each student will find all information necessary to complete the course requirements by clicking on the appropriate tab on the left side of the course home page. The due dates for course activities are found on the course schedule located at the end of this syllabus.
- Each chapter will have PowerPoint slides on Blackboard. Exam dates are found on the course schedule.
- ➤ Written Assignments: See instructions near the end of this document above the course schedule. Submit assignment by clicking on the Written Assignments tab in Blackboard.
- A signed Honor Code must be submitted to the instructor via Blackboard before submitting any assignments, exams, or quizzes.
- All exams (except pop quizzes) MUST be successfully passed with an average score of 75% or higher in order to pass the course. Students who achieve less than a 75% average on exams will receive a final course grade of D unless their exam average is calculated to be an F. Once the average exam score of 75% or greater has been achieved, the remainder of the course points will be calculated into the overall points to attain a final course grade. For this class, points achieved on pop quizzes are NOT included in the 75% average.
- > Students should access their MSU email accounts and Blackboard frequently, and daily if possible, to check for course announcements, information, or updates from the instructor.

NOTE: This course is very reading intensive and will require the student to keep up with the readings. Students will need to refer to the syllabus often and make sure the instructor is notified of any questions or concerns BEFORE feeling overwhelmed, if this should occur. The goal for the course is that everyone be successful, but the student must be proactive in the learning process in order to be successful.

The final grade in the course will be based on a percentage of possible points earned at the end of the course (points earned/possible points). Students who achieve less than a 75% average on exams (excluding open book online exams) will receive a final course grade of D unless their exam average is calculated to be an F.

#### **Grading and Rounding Policy:**

The MSU School of Nursing provides students with the educational opportunities needed to develop the knowledge, skills, and competencies necessary for professional nursing. All nursing courses must be passed with a grade of "C" (70%) or higher. Calculating a course grade will follow the process outlined below:

- The cumulative average of all exams in the didactic (lecture) component of this course **MUST be** equal to, or greater than, 75%. Exams will be defined in the course syllabus.
- Students who achieve 60% to 75% on exams will receive a final course grade of a "D". If their cumulative exam percentage is calculated to be less than 60%, an "F" will be given as the final course grade.
- **After** a 75% or higher is earned as the exam average in the didactic component of this course, the remainder of the course components will be calculated into the course grade. The final course grade will be the average of all components of the course.

For calculation of a final course grade, the final course grade must be 0.5 or higher in order to be rounded up to the next higher whole number.

#### **Exams:**

Regular exams will be taken in the classroom. Pop quizzes cannot be made up. If you are not present on the day the pop quiz is given, you will receive a zero for that quiz. All exams will be given according to the course schedule located at the end of this syllabus and are to be taken as scheduled. Time and dates are non-negotiable. If extenuating circumstances occur, the student is responsible for contacting the faculty member <u>prior</u> to the testing period. Failure to notify the faculty before the scheduled day of the exam will result in a 10% penalty of the total points of the test per day.

No ball caps will be allowed while taking a quiz or exam. Water bottles will be kept on the floor. Students are not allowed to have personal computers, books, pen/pencil, paper, purse, book bag, cell phone, pagers, or similar communication devices within the area where they are taking the exam. See BSN handbook for more information on testing policies. Students will have **5 days after an exam or quiz to contest any discrepancies.** All material in the text from assigned chapters is testable information.

#### **Faculty Availability:**

Office hours will be as listed above or other times by appointment. Email is the preferred method of contacting the instructor. Every attempt will be made to answer emails received Monday through Friday within 24 hours. Emails received after 1700 Friday will be answered by 1700 the following Monday. Phone calls or voice mail messages left on the office phone may not be retrieved on a daily basis, therefore, students are to use the instructor's cell phone number if it is necessary to speak directly to the instructor.

#### **Honor Code:**



Bachelor of Science in Nursing

The School of Nursing offers a generic, 4-year nursing program that leads to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree (BSN). Admission to this program is by application and selection as stated in the admission policies. Student should refer to the *BSN Student Handbook* for additional information on the policies and procedures in the School of Nursing.

# Admission to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program

Admission to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program (BSN) is competitive and selective, and not all who apply can be accommodated. Students will be admitted to the nursing program once a year for full-time study. Applications for admission to the program are due January 31, on or before 5:00 PM CST and will be reviewed beginning February 1 in the year prior to summer admission, and continue until the class is full.

Students are encouraged to meet with an advisor in the School of Nursing prior to or upon entering the University to ensure the proper selection and sequencing of prerequisites for the BSN program. The decision to admit a student to the BSN program will be based on a holistic picture of the completed course work and values that are consistent with the conduct of the profession and the ANA Code of Ethics for Nurses (ANA, 2015).

### **Admission Policies**

- 1. Admission to Missouri State University.
- 2. Completion of application to the Generic BSN program to the School of Nursing, including a current resume.
- 3. Submission of official transcripts of all college course work.
- 4. Completion of a minimum of 43 credit hours.
- 5. Completion of the General Education Foundations courses, except Writing II (including those listed in section A. of program requirements) at the time of application to the program, and have no more than one General Education requirement (other than those listed in section A. of program requirements) remaining at the time the nursing program begins. Also, NUR 472(3) and statistics may be taken during the nursing program as a prerequisite or co-requisite with NUR 442(6), but must be taken prior to the spring semester of the senior year in the program.
- 6. Completion of the prerequisites <u>BMS 307(4)</u> or <u>KIN 250(3)</u>; <u>BMS 308(4)</u> or <u>KIN 252(3)</u> with a grade of "B-" or higher.
- 7. Completion of the specific General Education requirements listed in section A. of program requirements with a grade of "C" or higher.

- 8. MTH 135(3) or a higher numbered mathematics course listed in the General Education Quantitative Literacy requirement, chemistry, and anatomy will be given additional points in the selection process if completed by the January 31 application date.
- 9. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 in all attempted college course work. Complete nursing prerequisites with a grade of "C" or higher.
- 10. Meet technical standards of the program in order to successfully undertake the course of study. These standards are available upon request from the program.
- 11. Submit evidence of current immunizations (MMR, Tetanus, Varicella, complete Hepatitis B series, and a PPD or evidence of appropriate medical follow-up for PPD positive individuals).
- 12. Current American Heart Association (AHA) Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers certification. AHA course information and requirements may be accessed at <a href="http://www.onlineAHA.org">http://www.onlineAHA.org</a>.

Bachelor of Science in Nursing

The School of Nursing offers a Junior-Senior level nursing program leading to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree (BSN). Degree candidates must be registered nurse graduates of associate degree or diploma nursing programs. Admission to the program is by application and selection as stated in the admission policies. Students should refer to the *BSN Student Handbook* for additional information on the policies and procedures in the School of Nursing.

Continuing enrollment in Missouri State must be maintained to be considered a student in the BSN program. Students who interrupt their education for a year or more must follow University

readmission policies and petition the School of Nursing to be reinstated in the nursing program at which time the previous course work will be reevaluated.

### Retention, progression and graduation policies

- 1. After admission into the Nursing major, the students must achieve the following for retention in the major.
  - 1. Achieve a grade of "C-" or better in all required courses.
  - 2. Receive a "pass" in all clinical evaluations.
  - 3. Maintain a University cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher.
  - 4. Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.50 or higher in all nursing and supportive courses.
  - 5. Courses in the nursing major may not be taken more than twice.
  - 6. Credit for upper division nursing courses taken more than 8 years before the student's date of graduation may be disallowed by the School of Nursing.
  - 7. Maintain current immunizations, annual PPD or appropriate medical follow-up for PPD positive individuals, and health insurance requirements.
  - 8. Maintain current American Heart Association BLS for Healthcare Providers certification.
- 2. Students who fail to meet the retention criteria may be (a) placed on academic or clinical probation in the nursing major, or (b) dismissed from the nursing program. Students on academic probation must achieve a grade of "B-" or higher in the next 9 hours of coursework in nursing or supporting courses attempted. Students on clinical probation must receive a "Pass" in all remaining nursing clinical courses. Students who fail to meet the probationary criteria or are dismissed from the program are not eligible for readmission to the nursing major.

Bachelor of Science in Nursing

The School of Nursing offers a Junior-Senior level nursing program leading to a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree (BSN) <u>for registered nurses</u>. Degree candidates must be <u>licensed</u> registered nurse graduates of associate degree or diploma nursing programs. Admission to the program is by application and selection as stated in the admission policies. Students should refer to the <u>BSN\_C Student Handbook</u> for additional information on the policies and procedures in the School of Nursing.

**Admission Policies** 

- 1. Acceptance of application to the University by the Office of Admissions. (Note: Admission to the University does NOT automatically constitute acceptance for the professional program in nursing.)
- 2. Current licensure in good standing as a registered nurse in the State of Missouri or in the state where they practice.
- Students preparing to graduate from an RN program may apply and be provisionally
  accepted to the BSN-C program, but will be unable to take NRS courses until the RN
  licenses has been attained.
- 4. Provide evidence of current health insurance.
- 5. GPA of 2.75 2.50 or higher on a 4.00 scale, based on at least 30 hours of college work. GPAs below 2.75 2.50 will be considered on an individual basis.
- 6. Current American Heart Association BLS for Healthcare Providers certification.
- 7. Submit evidence of current immunization (MMR, Tetanus, Varicella, complete Hepatitis B series, and a PPD (or evidence of appropriate medical follow-up for PPD positive individuals)).
- 8. An admission conference with a member of the School of Nursing <u>Ffaculty or advisor is</u> recommended for direction in sequencing courses.
- 9. Applicants must demonstrate acceptable levels of maturity, integrity, and behaviors and attitudes normally expected of professional nurses.
- 10. Applicants must demonstrate acceptable academic potential to successfully complete the program.
- 11. Application deadlines for admission are August 1 for the fall starts semester, December 1 for the spring starts semester, and May 1 for the summer starts semester.

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#### **Application Process**

The application process for the BSN-C program is now completed through the <u>Nursing CAS</u>. The following items are required to complete the CAS application.

- Acceptance of application to the University by the Office of Admissions. (Note: Admission to the University does NOT automatically constitute acceptance for the professional program in nursing.)
- 2. Missouri State University Bearpass/M number and email address
- 3. Application Fee to the School of Nursing of \$50.00 (pay online at <a href="https://commerce.cashnet.com/NursingDept">https://commerce.cashnet.com/NursingDept</a>)
- 4. Proof of RN license without disqualification in state of practice or expected date of graduation from RN program. Students preparing to graduate from an RN program may apply and be provisionally accepted to the BSN-C program, but will be unable to take NRS courses until the RN licenses has been achieved, attained.

#### **Provisional Admission Requirements**

Once the application has been accepted by the School of Nursing, the student will be granted provisional acceptance until the following requirements are completed and/or documentation is submitted to and accepted by the School of Nursing. Students will not be allowed to register for NRS courses until complete acceptance has been granted.

1. Criminal background check

- The School of Nursing will email <u>the student information regarding</u> completion of ng a criminal background check.
- The applicant must receive a clear background check without convictions of any crime pursuant to Section 660.317 RSMo or other disqualifications that would prohibit licensure as a registered nurse.

2. Urine drug screening

- The School of Nursing will email information regarding the required urine drug screening. The information will be time sensitive, and it will be the responsibility of the student to complete the testing before the time elapses.
- The applicant must receive a clear drug screening that would not hinder the professional actions of a registered nurse or would prohibit licensure as a registered nurse.

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#### Additional Rrequirements of the Pprogram

Once accepted into the BSN-C program, students will be required to <u>purchase items required</u> <u>for clinical and submit the following program compliance <del>proof and documentation; purchase items required for clinical.</del></u>

- 1. When starting coursework students will need to pay the fee for tracking software (Typhon) \$50.00. \(\frac{1}{2}\)
- 2. Prior to clinical course work the nursing students will be required to provide the following documentation:
  - Proof of negative TB status (within 1 year) or medical follow-up if positive (renewed annually)
  - Proof of influenza vaccination documentation for clinical (renewed annually)
  - Proof of <u>c</u>Current American Heart Association <u>Basic Life Support (BLS)</u> for <u>Healthcare Providers</u> certification.
  - Proof of <u>varicella (chicken pox)</u> vaccination (series of two) for, or immunity titer to, <u>Varicella (chicken pox)</u>
  - Proof of measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) immunization as an adult immunity
    of measles, mumps, and rubella by titer OR MMR immunization as an adult
  - Proof of vaccination for hepatitis B (must complete series of 3 vaccinations) or immunity titer.
  - Proof of tetanus vaccination (within 10 years)
  - Proof of current health insurance
  - Proof of professional liability insurance (mM-inimum limits of \$1,000,000 each occurrence and \$3,000,000 aggregate)
- 3. Students are required to purchase community uniforms shirt and initial equipment before beginning nursing clinical courses. The complete community uniform is outlined in the BSN-C handbook. Items required for purchase include a School of Nursing polo Shirt and name badge.
- 4. Students are expected to provide their own transportation to clinical sites.
- Students are required to pay course fees for each semester they are enrolled in clinical nursing courses.

#### Technical Rrequirements

The Missouri State University BSN-C is an online program. Didactic online content is delivered using asynchronous and synchronous formats. Applicants to the BSN-C program must be computer literate and be comfortable using word processing, spreadsheet management, and presentation graphics software. Students are expected to manage files, navigate the internet and access resources, and use a headset, computer : camera, video, scanner, and fax machine email. Students who have deficiencies in these areas are encouraged to seek training before the start of the program.

The School of Nursing uses a the Blackboard course management system for all courses. Students will be required to upload documents, and download files. Additionally, the Adobe Macromedia software is used for synchronous course offerings and other experiences. Video conferencing software may be used, with Adobe Macromedia or Skype software. Requirements of the program include access to broadband (Ecable or DSL) connections, a web camera and microphone headset, and a laptop computer with wireless capabilities to meet the minimal hardware requirements. Our MSU multimedia content is optimized for Internet Explorer and Firefox.

#### Additional requirements of the program

- 6. Students will be required to initiate and pay for any security checks and drug screenings required for clinical agencies.
- 7. Apply for criminal record check and receive response that the applicant has not been convicted of any crime pursuant to Section 660.317 RSMo or other disqualifications that would prohibit licensure as a registered nurse.
- 8. Students are expected to purchase community uniforms and initial equipment before beginning nursing courses. A list of the items and their prices can be obtained from the School of Nursing.
- 9.—Students are expected to provide their own transportation to clinical sites.
- 10. Students are required to pay course fees for each semester they are enrolled in clinical nursing courses.
